

MEMORANDUM FOR ALL CAP MEMBERS

FROM: CAP/CC

SUBJECT: CAP Nondiscrimination Policy

- Civil Air Patrol is committed to equality of opportunity in offering access to its educational and operational programs and activities. Nondiscrimination and diversity are critical to our success as an organization.
- 2. CAP provides an inclusive and welcoming environment for all members and ensures that educational, membership and operational decisions are based on each individual's abilities and qualifications. Consistent with this practice and applicable laws, it is CAP policy that no member shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or subjected to discrimination with respect to accessibility to any CAP program or activity on the basis of race, sex, age, color, religion (creed), national origin (ancestry), sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability (formerly handicap), marital status, military or veteran status. However, each case is subject to applicable qualifications and ability standards for the CAP program or activity concerned. Further, it is Civil Air Patrol policy that no applicant meeting CAP's minimum age requirement will be denied membership in CAP on the basis of any of the foregoing characteristics. This policy is intended to ensure that only relevant factors are considered and that equitable and consistent standards of conduct and performance are applied.
- Commanders at all levels are responsible for ensuring that members under their command are aware of and adhere to CAP's nondiscrimination policy.
- Allegations of violations of the CAP Nondiscrimination Policy will be sent to the Equal
 Opportunity Officer (EOO), Lt Col Walter Vertreace. Submission of allegations and/or complaints
 directly to the CAP/EOO will not be considered a violation of the chain of command.

Specific Duties:

- 1. Provide strategic planning and oversight for institutional diversity and inclusion in all areas, including but not limited to programs, personnel, and resources.
- 2. Monitor diversity statistics and analyze the data for trends.
- 3. Advise the Wing Commander on ways to improve the climate within their wing.
- 4. Collaborate with stakeholders to leverage effective practices to diversify membership, leadership, and staff teams.
- 5. Serve as a resource to identify and implement best practices, programs, and processes across the wing.
- 6. Work with other members of the Wing Staff to provide strategic communications and public outreach, and to guide recruiting and retention efforts to promote a diverse membership.
- 7. Assist with developing local partnerships and activities with organizations that share similar missions and attract membership from historically underrepresented populations.
- 8. Support the Wing Staff on developing and updating publications (supplements, operating instructions, pamphlets, brochures, websites, etc.) to encourage diversity, reflect the diverse population, and remove barriers to participation.

Safety Always

HAVE YOU BEEN ON A NICE TRIP LATELY?

Hopefully it did not result in a fall or injury.



Same level falls, like slips and trips, make up 65% of fall injuries. According to OSHA, slips, trips and falls constitute the majority of workplace accidents. Most slip, trip and fall incidents are preventable with general precautions and safety measures. Trying to catch your balance when you slip or trip can cause sprains and strains to muscles or joints and permanent back injuries, even if you don't fall. Falls can cause serious injuries such as severe head injuries, back injuries, paralysis, broken bones, sprains and strains to muscles and even death.

Slips

A slip occurs when there is too little traction or friction between the shoe and walking surface.

Some causes of slips include:


- · Wet walking surfaces
- · Oil or other slippery material on the floor
 - Environmental factors (ice, snow or mud)
- Materials such as scraps of wood or cloth on the floor
- Footwear with sole that are not appropriate for walking surfaces
- Poor lighting
 Personal factors (distractions, physical condition)

Trips

A trip occurs when a person's foot contacts an object or drops to a lower level unexpectedly and they are thrown off balance.

Some causes of trips include:

- · Cords or hoses on the floor
- Uneven of damaged walking surfaces
- · Debris or materials left in walking areas





- Poor lighting
- View forward obstructed by the materials carried by the person
- Personal factors (distractions, physical condition)
 Unanchored or uneven mats
- Loose or poor fitting footwear

Here are some simple ways to reduce your risk of a slip, trip and fall incident:

- •Practice good housekeeping keep work areas clean and free of spills or debris, clean or draw attention to spills immediately and clean up or report any debris as soon as practical
- •Wear proper footwear anticipate environmental conditions (ice, snow, rain) and working environment, use footwear that reflects these conditions •Change light bulbs as needed report flickering or burnt out lights to ensure properly lit workspaces
- •Use a flashlight if you will be walking through or working in a dim environment, bring your own source of light to help you identify hazards •Be a cautious carrier don't carry a load that will obstruct your view while walking and make sure that you have a clear walkway to utilize before picking up large objects
- Take your time if you anticipate slip or trip hazards, walk with caution and make wide turns at corners
- •Learn to walk adjust you walking speed and pace that is suitable for the walking surface, use rails or other stable objects to help you balance, walk with your feet pointed slightly out, keeping your center of balance under you and use your feet as probes to detect possible slips and trip hazards

Follow this simple rule to reduce slips, trips and falls at home and in the workplace: If you drop it, pick it up. If you spill

it, wipe it up. Look where you are going, and go where you are looking

About Facebook.....

The following excerpts ae taken from the Public Affairs Facebook Group. It's a closed group. Anything in quotes is from a group member other than myself.



"Don't download/copy and republish content from one CAP Facebook Page to another CAP Facebook Page. Use the Share button."

"Duplicate content is penalized in Facebook's algorithm. When content is duplicated, it is more likely to be stolen intellectual property or a product of fake news."

"We need to work together as a team when publishing content so the source makes sense, and we can then share from that source."

"I am sure most intentions are honorable, and it does extend the reach of the content, but copying and reposting also siphons traffic away from the originating site. By sharing, instead, you not only give the content a wider audience, you also help to promote the page from which it originated. It becomes a win-win for all CAP units involved. "

"Facebook demotes duplicate content. The "copy and share" method is a tactic of fake news and copyright violators. There should not be duplicates of the same photo or video on different pages and groups. "We just need to make sure to work better as a team to get the right content published in the right place before sharing and amplifying it."

"You can achieve the same effect by adding your own comments when you share. In that way you actually extend the reach not only of the content but also of the originating site."

"I have found a greater response comes when I share a post (or paste a link), then leave a sentence or two introduction, basically making it our own at the squadron level. I believe FB's algorithms recognize the 'effort' and present the post to more subscribers."

Let's get out there and share those Civil Air Patrol posts! I share Civil Air Patrol flying posts to five or six local aviation related Facebook groups and a page. The page owner shares puts some of the posts in his blog "The Aero Experience". I share posts about cadets and cadet activities to four Scott AFB Home Education and Spouse Facebook groups.

To ensure we are branded and following the rules, read through CAPP 152 the Official How-To Guide for Social Media.

Civil Air Patrol is ready to launch its new Learning Management System, "AXIS". Over the coming months we will be transitioning all online learning materials away from the legacy system and into this new one. AXIS provides a modern responsive design, with extensive features for interaction, testing, and content. The move to this system reflects CAP's commitment to online learning and providing expanded opportunities in this environment.

The official launch of Axis is scheduled for today, 7 May. The initial offerings will consist of a small number of courses to ensure that everything is working properly. Afterwards, every few weeks more courses will be released on Axis until all materials have been transferred. During the transition process, courses and quizzes will be temporarily available on both systems to allow work in progress to be completed.

Members will be able to get to AXIS by logging into eServices, going to Learning Management System and then clicking on <u>Go To</u>

<u>AXIS</u> at the top of the page. Upon their initial login members will be enrolled in six courses that are being used to kick off the new system.

Results from courses completed in Axis will still appear in each individual member record and in the legacy LMS system. By going to the Past Results link and selecting AXIS LMS Results you will be able to see courses completed, and the scores received in them. The existing LMS framework will continue to provide many of the functions it does currently. However, the adoption of AXIS provides us with new opportunities for creating reports and other feedback items in addition to what was previously available.

Motorola radio roll-out begins



Those of you who have been CAP members for a while may remember when we got the "new" EF Johnson radios, replacing the Nutec radios and signaling the end of using Amateur Radio equipment. It's been over 15 years now and the Johnson radios have served us well, but it's time to start replacing them. This applies to all VHF base radios, mobile radios and handheld radios.



Beginning this summer, we will be installing the Motorola APX 4500 radios in all corporate vehicles. While the new radios have all the same capabilities as the old ones, there are some enhancements we well:

GPS position reporting

Bluetooth compatible

Talk-around (transmitting on the repeater output frequency)

Voice announcement of channel selection

There are some policy changes though you should be aware of:

Motorola mobile radios will only be permitted in corporate vehicles

There are differences in the radios purchased as base stations and mobile radios, and they are not interchangeable

The good news is that in most cases we will be able to retain the Johnson radios so we will actually wind up with more radios in the long run.

We will schedule a conference call in the near future to go over the details on the roll-out as well as other communication topics. In the mean time, if you want more information or if you routinely use the radio in a COV, there is a short course in Learning Management System on how to operate the new radio. I encourage all communicators to take this course and start getting familiar with the equipment.
