Its members serve as crew for all our Cadet Glider Orientation Flights, and are a great source of information regarding soaring and sailplanes. In consideration of our close relationship, the club will offer a discounted membership fee of \$50 for CAP Senior Members. Safety Always



DO YOU FIND YOURSELF TAKING NAPS OFTEN?

As I have gotten older, I find that the afternoon nap has become one of my most cherished times of the day. However those frequent unexpected times when you fall over may be a sign of something more serious. As emergency responders CAP takes this issue seriously with rest requirements and limits on our duty day. But since we don't control when emergencies happen, this is an important factor to consider when doing your self assessment for responding to a mission. Since most of us are juggling a career and family obligations along with our commitment to serve, proper rest can be easily overlooked. Here are some facts about fatigue and its risks.



Fight Fatigue Risk

As our lives get ever busier, our sleep is often the first thing to go and we can quickly become fatigued. Being fatigued can have serious impacts on our health and safety, but some simple steps can help you get the rest you need. Don't sacrifice sleep

If you aren't getting the recommended 7-9 hours of sleep each day, consider these risks:

- When you miss out on sleep, it can affect more than just your productivity: fatigue can lead to decreases in cognitive performance, vigilance, accuracy and judgement, among many other effects
- Chronic sleep deprivation can cause a number of serious health risks, such as depression, obesity, cardiovascular disease and other illnesses
- Losing small amounts of sleep over time can be detrimental. A person who sleeps 6 hours a night for 2 weeks performs similarly to someone who loses one full night of sleep


Driving while fatigued can be similar to driving under the influence of alcohol. Driving on 4-5 hours of sleep means you are four times more likely to crash.

- Up to 70 million Americans have a sleep disorder, which are major drivers of fatigue.4 Left untreated, sleep disorders can contribute to decreased productivity, lead to higher rates of absenteeism and even exacerbate other health problems.
- A typical employer with 1,000 employees can expect to lose more than \$1 million each year to fatigue
- Not sure if you're fatigued? Micro sleeps and yawning are usually the only visible symptoms of fatigue, but hidden symptoms can include decreased vigilance, attention, memory and concentration.

Operations

Harvard, IL: On 9-11 August 35 members of the Illinois Wing participated in the IL Wing Annual Emergency Services Bivouac at the Dacy Airport in Harvard, IL. Air Crews and Ground members achieved requalification as well as initial qualification, in Mission Base positions as well as Ground Team and Air Crew Qualifications. Cadet's who showed up also enjoyed Orientation rides and 2 members got their Suas Form 5 check ride. Of particular note was one member who traveled from Springfield to participate and re-light his scanner qualification. Air crews also judged a signaling event from overhead at King of the Rock.









From CAPM39-1

Blues Shirts 4.1.9.2. Long-Sleeve/Short-Sleeve Blue Shirt. Mens blues shirt A V-neck or athletic style, white undershirt will be worn under the shirt.

Blues Shirts 4.1.10.2. Blouse (Long and Short-sleeved). Ladies blues blouse A V-neck or athletic style, white undershirt may be worn under the blouse. If worn, they will be tucked into the skirt or slacks.

Aviator Shirt Uniform 4.2.5.9. Undergarments. Men will wear white undershirt. Undershirt will not be visible if the collar is worn open. Men will wear plain black socks without design. White socks may be worn with boots. 4.2.6.9. Undergarments. Women, Wear of a white undershirt is authorized if not visible if the collar is worn open.

BDUs 5.1.1.4. T-Shirt. A black short or long sleeved t-shirt will be worn under the BDU shirt. Unit commanders may prescribe unit designation emblems, subject to the approval of the wing commander, not to exceed 5 inches in diameter, in cloth or silk screen, worn on the left side of chest. Neither unit designation emblems nor commercial logos will be visible when wearing the BDU coat (shirt). Black turtlenecks may also be authorized; thermal undergarments may be black, white, brown, or cream colored and are authorized for wear as weather conditions warrant. T-shirts and turtlenecks will not have pockets and all must be tucked into the trousers. Sleeves of long-sleeved t-shirts will not be visible if BDU shirt cuffs are rolled up.

Corporate Field Uniform (CFU) or Blue BDUs 5.1.1.4. T-Shirt. A black short or long sleeved t-shirt will be worn under the BDU shirt. Unit commanders may prescribe unit designation emblems, subject to the approval of the wing commander, not to exceed 5 inches in diameter, in cloth or silk screen, worn on the left side of chest. Neither unit designation emblems nor commercial logos will be visible when wearing the BDU coat (shirt). Black turtlenecks may also be authorized; thermal undergarments may be black, white, brown, or cream colored and are authorized for wear as weather conditions warrant. T-shirts and turtlenecks will not have pockets and all must be tucked into the trousers. Sleeves of long-sleeved t-shirts will not be visible if BDU shirt cuffs are rolled up.

Corporate Working Uniform (CWU) or Polo 5.2.2.8.1. A white undershirt may be worn if not visible when the collar is worn open. 5.2.2.8.2. Wear of a white undershirt is authorized if not visible if the collar is worn open. **To look professional, please do not wear long sleeve thermal undershirts with the short sleeve polo.**

USAF FDU Flight Duty uniform (Flight Suit) 8.2.8. Undergarments. Undergarments are mandatory. A black crew neck t-shirt will be worn. Thermal undergarments may be worn when weather conditions warrant, as long as they are not visible below the sleeve or above the t-shirt. 8.2.8.1. Thermal undergarments. Thermal undergarments (i.e., dickies, turtlenecks and mock necks) will be black and are authorized for wear with the FDU as weather conditions warrant.

Corporate Style Flight Duty Uniform (CFDU) (Flight Suit) 8.3.9. Thermal undergarments. Thermal undergarments (i.e., dickies, turtlenecks and mock necks) will be black and are authorized for wear with the FDI as weather conditions warrant. **It doesn't specifically say black t-shirts must be worn, but I'd say it's a safe bet to go with black only.**

ABUs T-Shirt – A standard Desert Tan short or long sleeved t-shirt will be worn under the ABU coat. Unit commanders may prescribe unit designation emblems, subject to the approval of the wing commander, not to exceed 5 inches in diameter, in cloth or silk screen, worn on the left side of chest. Logos may also be placed on the back of the t-shirt with the approval of the wing commander. Neither unit designation emblems nor clothing company logos will be visible when wearing the ABU coat (shirt). Tan turtlenecks may also be authorized; thermal undergarments may be desert sand, white or cream colored and are authorized for wear as weather conditions warrant. T-shirts and turtlenecks will not have pockets and all must be tucked into the trousers.

This is an interesting find from 1943! Still relevant today.

Subject: Proper Uniform

To: All Unit Commanders

1. Since the signing of the Executive Order transferring Civil Air Patrol from the Office of Civilian Defense to the War Department, it is more desirable than ever before that the uniform of Civil Air Patrol be proper according to the official authorization, and that when worn it be properly cleaned or laundered, as the case may be.

2. The acceptance of Civil Air Patrol by the Military, and the public as well, can be materially enhanced by all Unit Commanders requiring all members of their Command to present a neat appearance at all times while in uniform.

3. The wearing of unauthorized insignia or trick ornaments, fountain pens or pencils protruding from the pockets or shirt front, will be discouraged.
